To Seek the Lost, See the Savior & Serve the Community

Psalm 100: 1-2 Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth. Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.

One Sunday morning, the pastor noticed little Alex was staring up at the large plaque that hung in the foyer of the church. It was covered with the names of those who had died at war. The seven-year-old had been staring at the plaque for some time, so the pastor walked up, stood beside the boy and said quietly, "Good morning Alex."

"Good morning Pastor," replied the young man, still focused on the plaque. "Pastor, what is this?" Alex asked. "Well, son, it's a memorial to all the men and women who have died in one of the services."

Soberly, they stood together, staring at the large plaque. Finally with a puzzled look on his face, little Alex asked, "Which one, the 8:30 or the 10:00 service?"

I wonder if little Alex is saying something about what happened in the services of his church. The writer of the psalm starts with these words, "Sing to the Lord, all the world! Worship the Lord with joy." He is excited about coming to worship. He encourages everyone to sing with all their heart. He wants us to be thrilled at the prospect of coming to worship to meet God who wants to minister to us in our needs. He wants us to worship the Lord with joy.

We come here, to Grace Lutheran Church, to meet God. God ministers to us as he speaks to us after we have confessed our sin. He announces that our sins are forgiven through the death and resurrection of Jesus. The burden of guilt has been lifted from our shoulders and we are assured that God's love is still red hot for us, every though we have disappointed him so much.

We come here to meet God and he ministers to us through His Word. We hear again the words of promise, comfort, reassurances, and hope from God himself. As God ministers to us through our time here, that message is spoken to us again by God through His Word and our worship. No matter what is happening in our daily life, we are reminded that God is real; His power to help is real; we are His people; His love for us never ends.

We come here to worship God because He is worthy of our praise. A children's song says, "God is so good, hallelujah. God is so good, he's so good to me".

There are times when we would have to confess that we have gone to worship more out of a sense of duty than because we wanted to. Have you noticed that when your attendance at worship has dropped off or the thought of going to worship is not filled with anticipation and joy, it's because somehow you have lost sight of the purpose of why you go to worship? Somehow you have lost sight of the goodness of God in your everyday life. For some reason, you don't see that God has a powerful effect on your life and you take all that he gives for granted. That is when you should come to worship.

Worship is a time when God ministers to you,

- a time when God brings you into an intimate relationship with him through Word and Sacrament,
- a time when God strengthens you to face the hurts, problems and crises of your every day life,
- a time when you can praise and thank God for all His goodness,
- a time when you can serve others specially through your prayers,
- a time when you can respond with thanks and joy.

Yes, we do have a wonderful God. Let's listen to the psalmist when he calls out, "Sing to the Lord, all the world! Worship the Lord with joy; come before him with happy songs!" Submitted by Nathan Krause

LWML Convention Ingathering Project

The Emerald Coast Zone of the Lutheran Women's Missionary Leave (LWML) has asked our congregation to participate in an ingathering project for their National Convention, specifically collecting bath towels for health kits. Thrivent Financial has awarded our congregation a \$250 grant for an action team project to purchase and collect bath towels for



health kits to be distributed by Lutheran World Relief. The towels will be part of an ingathering health kit project at the LWML convention being held in Mobile, Alabama on June 20 - 23, 2019. Towel collection will be held at Grace on three Sundays in February, the 10th, 17th and 24th. A display will be set up in the Welcome Center with project information and samples. Our goal is to collect 200 or more light-weight bath-size towels, size 52" X 27", dark color recommended. We hope to be able to deliver towels collected to the LWML Zone President in March so they have time to organize and collect all the various health kit donations from all participating congregations for assembly at the National Convention. The samples on the display table are available from Walmart for \$2.74 from their 100% Cotton Mainstays Collection.

Stephen Ministers: The After People: People often ask, "What exactly is a Stephen Minister?"

One way to put it is that Stephen Ministers are the *After People* Stephen Ministers are there:

- after the phone call you hoped you'd never get
- after the divorce papers are served and the bottom falls out of your life.
- after the funeral, when everyone has let and the emotions you've held at bay come crashing in on you.
- after the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do."
- after the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, "Welcome to your new home."
- after the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away, and the house suddenly seems empty.
- after the gavel goes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.
- after the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.
- after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
- after your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the "After People." They are ready to come alongside you - or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives - and provide comfort and support for as long after as needed.
